
Good Shepherd Sunday

The Fourth Sunday of Easter is traditionally referred to as Good Shepherd Sunday. The reason is that the Gospel on this Sunday is always about Jesus being the shepherd of His people. It has been traditional on this Sunday to reflect on vocations to the priesthood and to pray for an increase in vocations especially in our own diocese. Vocations were something that we always took for granted. There were always two or more priests in a parish when we were growing up and there was always one ready to answer the door of the rectory or our phone call at a time of need. This is no longer true. The more common practice these days is that there is one priest for two or sometimes more parishes and he is spread pretty thin. Many of the newly ordained priests in our diocese are from other countries of the world especially South America and Africa and they have generously agreed to leave their native land and come to minister to us and to the many immigrants from other countries who are the fastest growing population in the American church. But what is lacking is young men coming forth from our midst to serve their fellow Catholics as well. The priesthood is a wonderful and rewarding life for any young man to consider. It is never dull and puts you into all kinds of situations that you never imagined. It is also grace filled and comforting to know that you have helped people find their way through the rough spots on the road of life. Take it from one who has been doing it for the last 51 years. This weekend pray for the young seminarians who are on their way towards the priesthood especially Alan Martineau and Kevin Chalifoux from Spencer and pray for others who may be hearing the call to have the courage to investigate it.
