THE HOLY YEAR OF MERCYOPEN WIDE THE DOOR

We have designated the door on the left side of the vestibule as the Holy Door for the Holy Year of Mercy. Today at the 10:15 Mass we will solemnly open this door with a blessing. A sign will be placed over the door announcing that this is the Holy Door and directly inside it you will find the framed decree designating our parish church as a pilgrimage church for the Holy Year. It is the feast of the Epiphany, the day on which the three kings came to Jesus as representatives of the whole world. It is also the first Sunday of the New Year. Hopefully all who come through our Holy Door will find Jesus in our church and in us as well.

MORE ABOUT THE HOLY YEAR

The Holy Year is traditionally observed every fifty years. It is a tradition that goes back to the Book of Leviticus in the Old Testament. In this tradition every 50 years people were invited to stop and celebrate a jubilee year. The year was meant to be a time to seek the forgiveness of sins, prisoners were released, debts were forgiven and the mercy of God was to be particularly manifested. When the jubilee custom was restored in the church, it took on a more spiritual nature. Theology had developed a somewhat legalistic idea of God as judge and sin and punishment. The jubilee became a time when you could be released from the bonds of sin and be set free from your time in purgatory (temporal punishment due to us for sins already forgiven) by performing certain spiritual acts which included the reception of the sacrament of confession, making a pilgrimage and praying for the intentions of the Holy Father. In short it was a time to make a new beginning. Pope Francis, when looking at the world and the church today realized that this was a need for us now. So he has proclaimed this to be a special year of mercy where will be given opportunities to both be touched by and make present to others the mercy of God. This jubilee year offers us the chance to come and have all of our sins forgiven and our slates wiped clean so to speak by coming to the merciful father and seeking His loving forgiveness. But, also included is the need to be merciful to others by practicing the works of mercy towards those around us which include charity and forgiveness of each other. Our church has been designated as one of the places where people can come and receive these graces. Our Holy Door which we open today extends a welcome to all to come and receive God's mercy but it also places on us an opportunity and an obligation to give these gifts to others. This is a blessed time for us. Let us use it well.
